

LEAD Diversion

LEAD as a diversion opportunity:

You may be eligible for a diversion into the LEAD program related to your current charge. If your charge is approved for diversion, the most important part of eligibility is your willingness to engage with the program to work on some self-identified goals (see general program brochure for more info).

If you are eligible for LEAD and accept the offer:

If you accept a diversion opportunity into LEAD you will need to complete your LEAD program intake within 30 days and begin engaging with the team to have your charge dropped. If you do not engage with the program, the charge will be pursued by the Prosecutor's Office. Once your intake is completed, the team will notify the prosecutor that you have completed this requirement and let them know if you are engaging in ongoing support.

What is next?

- You will provide your contact information such as a working phone number and where the LEAD team can find you.
- You will sign a release of information to coordinate your diversion along with any other releases of information that might help the team support you.

In addition to the general support the team can offer, they can also help you navigate connecting to resources and resolving other legal issues such as warrants.
